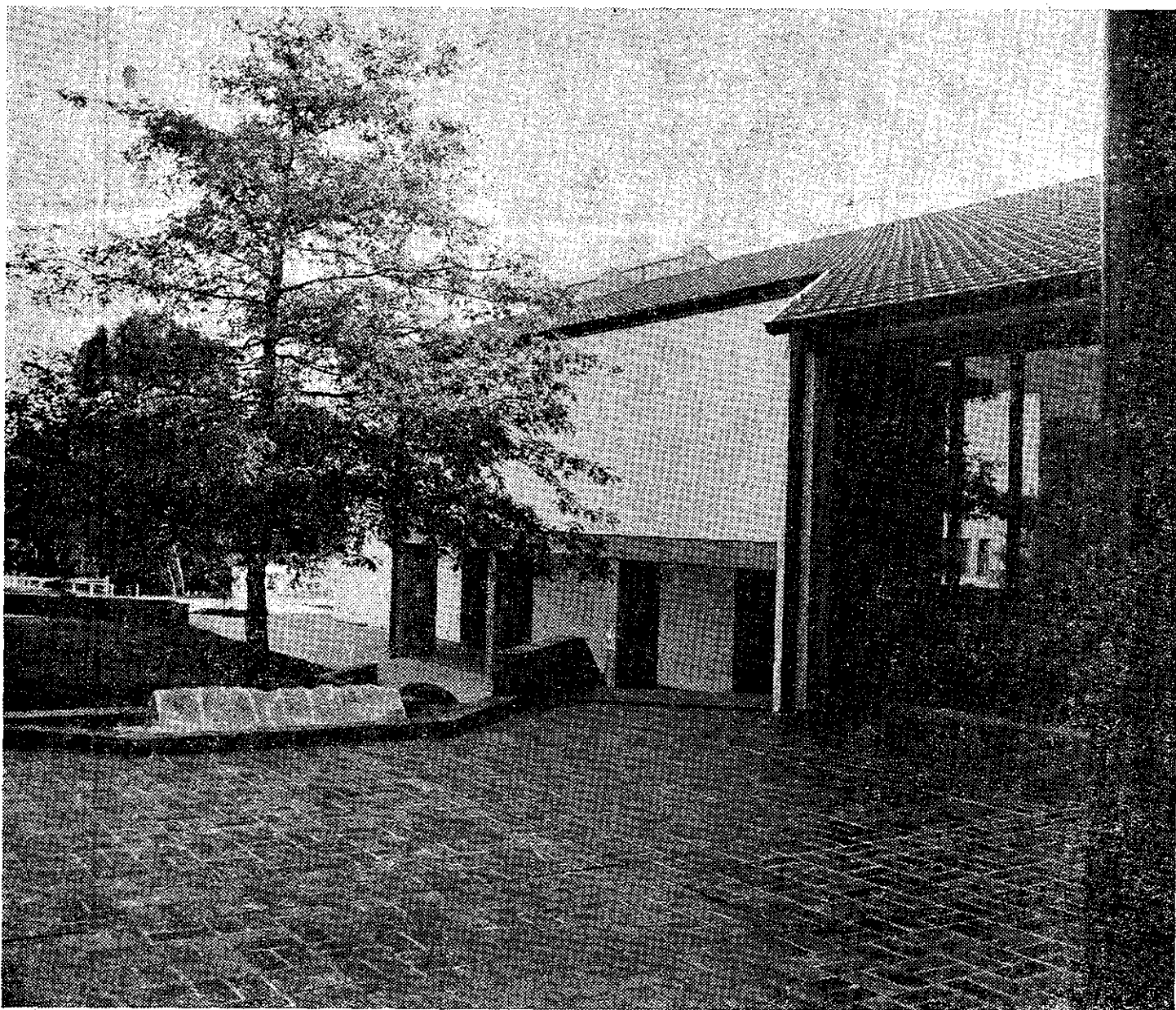

Repeat from + 31 times

Knit one row, Purl one row for 6 rows

You can then single and double crochet around your cape and fringe the bottom — or perhaps you would like to trim to your

own individual taste.

CHOCOLATE DATE

FINGERS

4 oz. butter or substitute

½ cup sugar (white or raw)

1 cup chopped dates

3 cups rice bubbles

3 oz. dark chocolate

½ oz. Copha

Melt butter in saucepan, add sugar and dates, stir over low heat until mixture boils and thickens. Remove from heat, stir in rice bubbles, mixing well.

Press mixture into a lamington tin lined with foil. Refrigerate until firm.

Melt chopped chocolate and copha in a basin over hot water.

Spread chocolate over mixture, decorating with a fork, or, if you prefer, chopped walnuts.

Cut into pieces when chocolate is firm.

Easy to make and good to eat.
