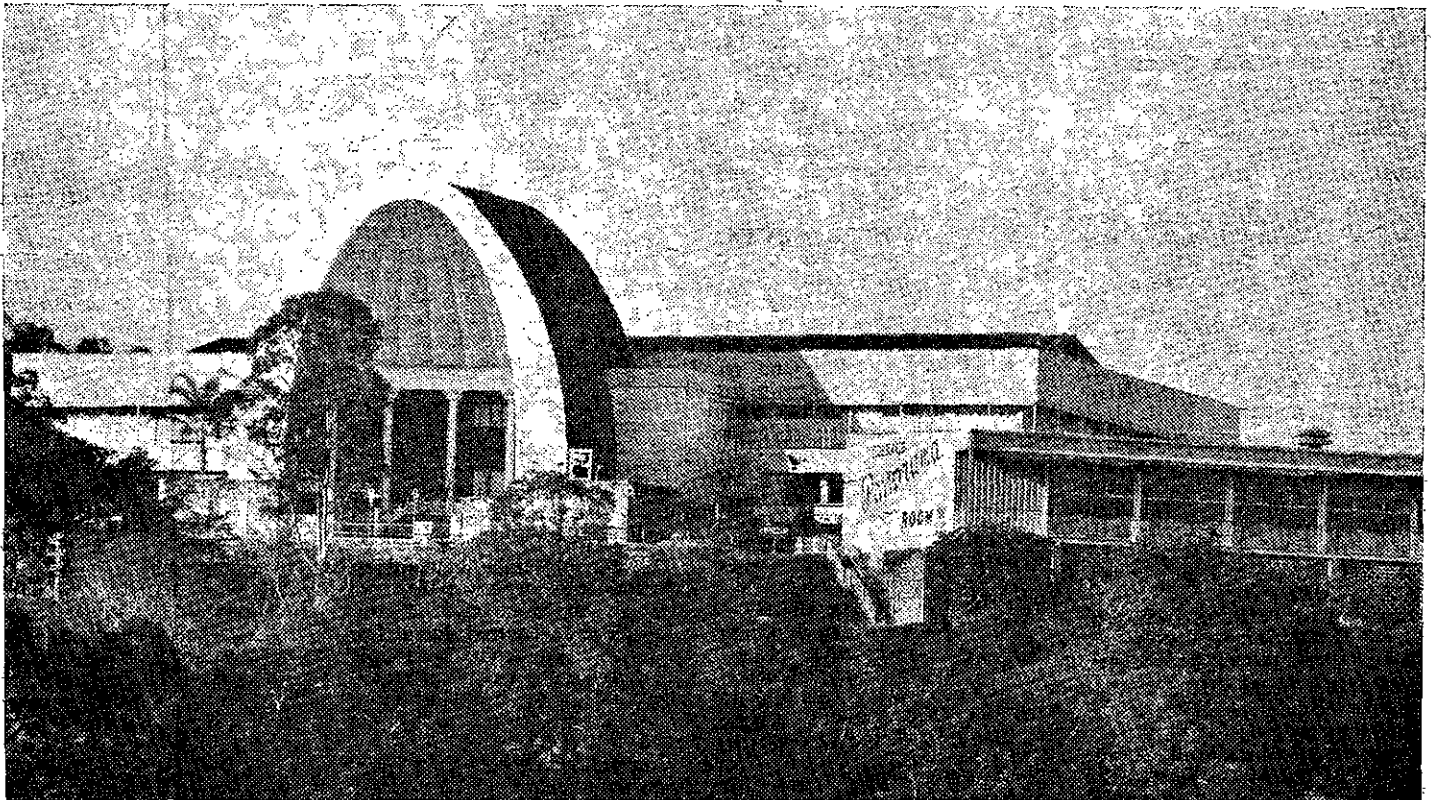

AMENDMENTS TO CONSTITUTION FOR THE OPERATION OF AUSTRALIAN NATIONAL SQUARE DANCE CONVENTIONS

Notice is hereby given by the undersigned to amend the following parts of the Constitution for the Operation of Australian National Square Dance Conventions.

MOTION NUMBER ONE

After Clause 6B "5. Publicity Manager" insert the following sentence —

Members of the Convention Committee shall be eighteen years of age or over.

REASON — The Convention Committee now handle vast sums of money and accordingly it is necessary to ensure the committee consists of people who are legally responsible.

MOTION NUMBER TWO

Under Clause 10B delete the following:

New South Wales and A.C.T. Dark Green.

Newcastle Light Green.

and substitute with the following:

New South Wales Green
Newcastle Olive.
A.C.T. — Pink.

REASON — The Australian Capital Territory is entirely different to New South Wales and in any bidding should not be confused with being part of New South Wales. This is particularly in view of the fact that square dancing is recommencing in the Australian Capital Territory. As far as Newcastle is concerned there has been confusion in recent years as to what constitutes light green. This slight variation will clarify matters.

MOTION NUMBER THREE

Under Clause 8 where the words "A balance sheet" occur in two sentences these words shall be substituted with the words "An audited balance sheet".

REASON — The money handled by the Convention Committee is now reaching such proportion that it is necessary to require proper auditing procedures.

MOTION NUMBER FOUR

Under Clause 11 H5 add the following sentence:

This confirmation shall include an undertaking by the Committee that this Constitution shall be adhered to and the programme

shall include all the essentials mentioned in this Clause.

REASON — In the past there has been a tendency of some Convention Committees to completely disregard some aspects of this Constitution once they have been elected. For a National Convention to be successful it must include all facets of square and round dancing including adequate discussion panels for the general improvement of the movement.

MOTION NUMBER FIVE

Clause 3 shall be amended by substituting the word "six" with the word "seven".

REASON — There are now seven past venues instead of six. The increase of one means that all of the areas are represented.

MOTION NUMBER SIX

Under Clause 4A delete the words "or New Zealand".

REASON — New Zealand operates its own conventions and accordingly this requirement does not now apply.

MOTION NUMBER SEVEN

Delete Clause 13 and in lieu thereof insert the following:

13. OFFICIAL RECORDER

To facilitate the correct continuance of records, a square dancer of long standing and reliable repute, shall be nominated to keep an independent set of records of the minutes of every convention. This person shall make available at cost copies of any of these minutes as required.

REASON — Mrs. Ella Whyte, the original Official Recorder, has indicated she no longer desires to continue with this service.

MOTION NUMBER EIGHT

Under Clause 11 insert a new clause "H" A Meeting of the Various Square Dance Societies and Organisations throughout Australia. The present Clause "H" shall be hereafter referred to as Clause "I".

REASON — This feature has now become a permanent part of the Convention Proceedings.

CALLING AT CONVENTIONS

Calling at a convention will often set a problem to the programmed callers. "What will I call?" they ask themselves. "I will wait for the next batch of records to come through and pick a new one."

The records come, a disc or two is selected and away we go. Gee, it's only two weeks to the convention. Now, is it fair to yourself to give out with a number that has not been "broken in".

A convention caller feels that he must always give his best — this is "impossible", simply because the caller does not get the opportunity. I maintain that a caller never calls as well at a convention as he does at his own club. For example, when club calling, the caller does not reach his peak until about the third bracket. Then he sails through the night with relaxed ease and splendid delivery. At a convention he may only call one, or perhaps two, numbers in the night and his time-slot could be early, mid-evening or late evening. No matter what time, he is not geared up and possibly has been dancing a lot and therefore it is only natural that he is not at his best.

Another thing, should callers with such a handicap commit themselves to a further endurance by calling a number they are not sure of, they can no doubt make themselves feel very inferior to their fellow callers.

There is an answer to all of this and that is, give the caller more calling and let him follow through with his numbers. But how do you arrive at this answer when you have between 60 and 70 callers attending a convention?

The dancing time is less than the time the callers need. No doubt the more experienced caller would be featured in a few spots and then again, he too is cut short; the lesser experienced caller, but one with qualifications, he has to be content to be just "fitted in".

Conventions these days have these ingredients:

- (i) More callers.
- (ii) Less dancing time.

(iii) More time for meetings. In Australia we do not have the availability of venue with multiple halls; this way we can help out and give the callers a go.

Or then again, a convention could staff only about 10 callers — but — who?

Perhaps with this idea the image of a convention would not be lost — bearing in mind, just because you have a record attendance, it does not make a good convention. I feel that a convention is not the place to go to learn to call or to learn to dance.

How about a competition — to tally how many times the "Grand Square" will be called at the Brisbane Convention. It is amazing — when there is a bracket of three dances — each caller will use a Grand Square in his singing call. I maintain a caller who wishes to call at a convention should have another qualification and that is adaption — if he is No. 2 caller in the bracket and No. 1 caller has used a Grand Square, then No. 2 should adapt and use something else, if he, too, was going to use a Grand Square. This experience, or qualification, or whatever you like to call it, helps me grade a caller. A caller with this ability is worthy of calling at a convention. As years go on, conventions will get bigger and time allowed for dancing will be shorter, there will be more callers and something has to happen. Many callers, no matter how well they call, no matter how good their club members think they are, will go by the board unless they have just that little bit of extra knowhow.

Also a tip to convention callers: Try and keep away from movements that require a lot of space. For instance, the caller who calls any movement at a convention where the floor is crowded that involves a line of eight, should be stripped of his microphones.

Brisbane Convention programmers can assure all that "Cloudland" will offer ample space for dancing, but callers should be warned to watch the floor when another caller is calling and learn from his mistakes, if any.

Many of the dancers had taken the opportunity to make

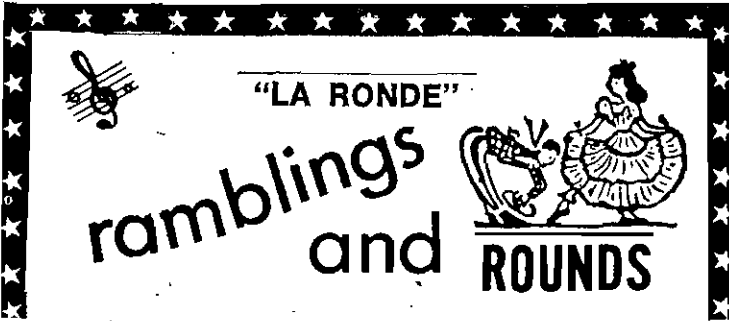
a weekend of it. And I hear that the cry went up of let's do it again.

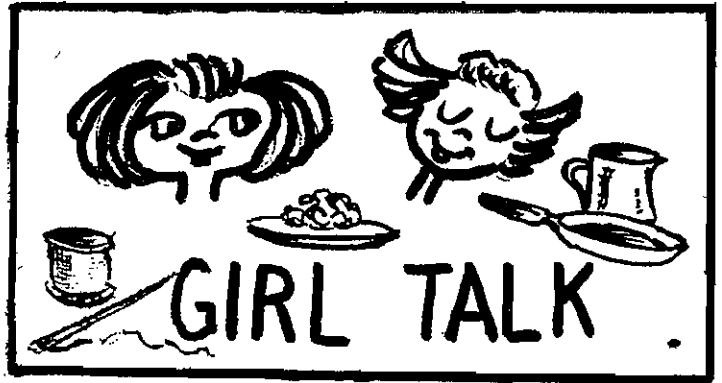

Choko season, so a recipe for pickles and, keeping up our health programme, a recipe for scones from Sussex Inlet.

MUSTARD PICKLE

- Ingredients:**
 1 1/2 lb. Chokos.
 1 1/2 lb. onions.
 1 1/2 cups sugar (raw if preferred).
 3 cup plain flour.
 1 1/2 tablespoons mustard.
 1/2 tablespoon tumeric.
 1/2 tablespoon curry powder.
 1 teaspoon mixed spice.
 1 tablespoon treacle.
 1 1/2 pints brown vinegar.

Vegetables may be varied by adding cauliflower and green beans in place of all chokos.

Method:

Cut vegetables into small pieces, stand in brine for 24 hours. (Brine: 2 quarts water and 1/2 cup salt).

Boil vegetables in brine for 3-5 minutes depending on size of pieces.

Strain vegetables and set aside.

Bring near boil 1 1/2 pints brown vinegar and thicken with dry ingredients (dry ingredients mixed

with a little vinegar). Stir till thickened, add strained vegetables. Boil for a few minutes and then stir in 1 tablespoon treacle.

Allow to cool, then bottle.

LOW CHOLESTEROL SCONES

Ingredients:

- 2 large cups of S.R. flour.
 2 ozs. Polyunsaturated oil.
 6 ozs. milk.
 1/2 teaspoon salt.

Method:

Sift into large bowl flour and salt. Make well in centre. Pour oil and milk, previously mixed, into flour. Using a knife, mix flour and liquid together to make scone mixture.

On a floured board pat to about 3/4 to 1" thick. Cut into shape and bake on scone tray at 425 deg. F. for about 15 minutes. Makes about 12 light and crusty scones.

Convention Profile:**MEET OUR 1979 TREASURER —
GRAHAM BALDWIN (QLD.)**

Brisbane square dance caller, Graham Baldwin, was born and educated in Sydney, N.S.W. He attended Balgowlah High School. Before leaving school he was first introduced to square dancing at 14 years of age by accompanying his mother, who at the time was a keen square dancer, to a dance held at Collaroy Plateau, whose caller was Len Woodhead.

Len encouraged Graham with his dancing and later his calling. Graham, who was always musically minded, responded well. From there he began visiting other clubs in Sydney, whose callers also helped him with his calling.

At one of the annual Allan Blackwell Memorial Dances held at Cammeray, an Amateur Callers Contest was arranged and Graham decided to enter. He was successful in gaining second place that night, so he then decided to go through the Callers Class conducted by Ron Jones.

He later joined one of Ron's exhibition teams and also entered many competitions. It was during this time that he met a girl named Denise, who became his dancing partner and later his wife. They continued training and dancing together and set up their first home in Sydney.

After they both attended the 13th National Square Dance Convention in Brisbane in 1972, they liked what they saw and decided to move to Brisbane.

They began dancing with Eric Wendell at Milton where Eric took Graham under his wing and

encouraged him with his calling and helped him get his first P.A. system together.

They built their present home at Woodridge and decided to open their first club there and later moved the club to Acacia Ridge. They named the club the "El-Paso Stars" and have been running successfully for five years now, with many happy nights being danced there.

Graham was elected as Treasurer for the Queensland Square Dancing Society and did a very successful job for four years. He only decided to stand down when the pressure of his work increased and also they were expecting their first child who was born on 17th January, 1978.

Graham and Denise have attended most National Square Dance Conventions since they commenced dancing.

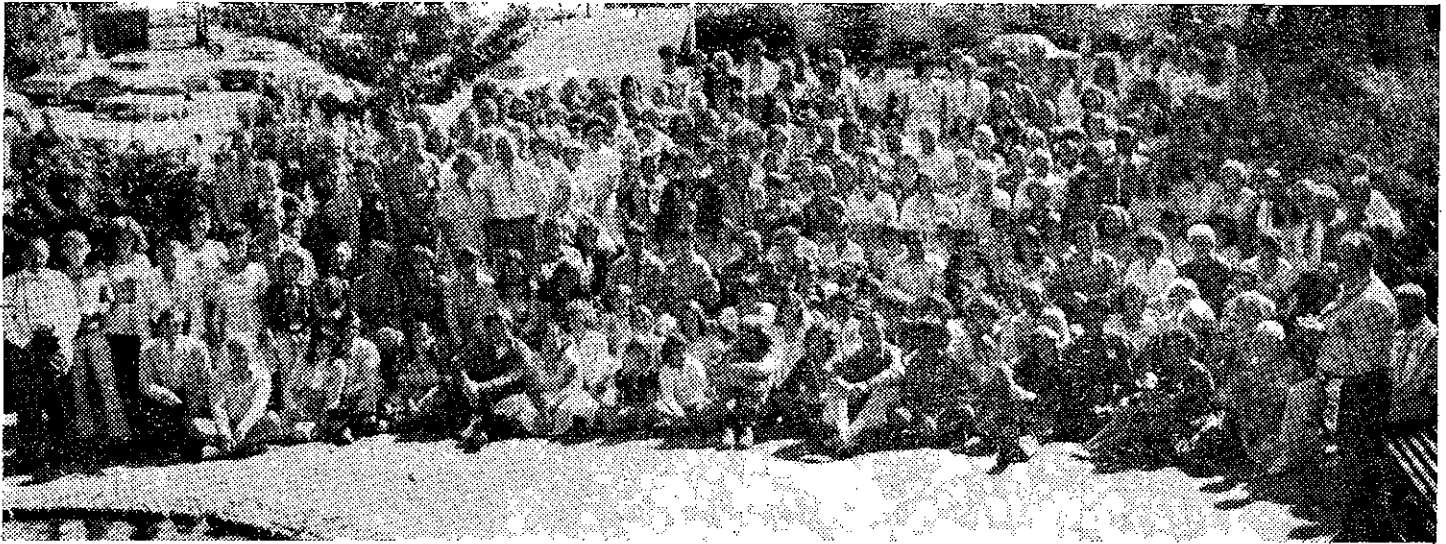

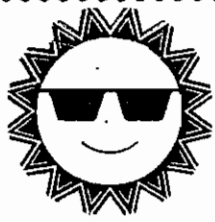
