## AUSTRALIAN SQUARE DANCE TOUR TO NORTH AMERICA, 1981

The tour was arranged for 28 people, mainly square dancers from the Essendon and Thornbury Clubs and was organised by Edna and Jim Daniel, co-ordinated by the A.N.Z. Travel Centre. The combination resulted in an excellent trip with no hitches, departing from Tullamarine on Saturday, 13th June and returning to Melbourne thirty-five days later.

The flight by Pan-Am Jumbo jet to Honolulu was good, the highlight being sunrise over the Pacific, viewed from 33,000 feet when the black-purple of night gave way to the colour spectrum—a sight to be remembered. We arrived in San Francisco about 8.00 p.m. Saturday. Next morning we toured "the City of Hills," enjoying the summer weather and taking in the famous spots such as Union Square, Fisherman's Wharf, Golden Gate and the Oakland Bay Bridges, a ferry trip on the Bay included sailing past Alcatraz Island and under both bridges. Later we rode on the famous cable cars—a great novelty, no doubt. Our stay at San Francisco was at Fisherman's Wharf at the "Howard Johnson" which really proved a highlight of the trip, the feature being a small TV set mounted on the vanity table in the bathroom.

On Tuesday, 16th June, we left San Francisco and met our coach driver, David Hoffman, who was with us for 22 days. The bus was a very new and well equipped vehicle with all mod. cons. We travelled over the Oakland Bay Bridge and stopped at Cathy's Valley for our first picnic lunch, the temperature being 105 deg. F. We passed through the old gold mining centre of Mariposa with breathtaking views of huge granite mountains rising each side of the highway.

Yosemite was our stopping place for the next two nights and what a delightful place it is,

set in a pine forest. Outside our door of the motel unit we welcomed grazing deer, chipmunks and raccoons. Continuing on our journey we drove through the valley with great granite outcrops of El Capitan and Half Dome rising 3,500 feet above and waterfalls cascading as we sped on the way to Sacramento through the Sierra Nevada Mountains where a short stop along the way showed us the giant Sequoia trees.

We arrived in Sacramento, the City of Trees, at 4.00 p.m. with the 101 deg. temperature. This city, the old Mexican capital until the Mexican war, still has a strong Spanish influence in its architecture. It has fine public buildings and a sense of history in its preservation of the 19th century area, "Old Sacramento" and such places as Sutter's Fort, built by Sutter, who opened up this area. Our stay at the "Red Lion" Motel, a huge structure of three stories, radiating in several wings from the Administration core, was enjoyable, due to its excellent appointments. We did a tour of the city, but our highlight was a conducted tour over the California Highway Patrol Academy.

We left Sacramento for our next stopping place, which was Grant's Pass. We travelled up the Sacramento Valley, 300 miles long by 100 miles wide—a great fertile plain irrigated with unlimited water. As far as the eye could see, there were farms raising crops of wheat, barley, maize, hops, vegetables and fruit. We had a picnic lunch at Lake

Chasta, then on again over the border to the State of Oregon. After our arrival at Grant's Pass, we left the motel for a square dance, which we found out, had been held the night before, so it was necessary to travel over 30 miles for the next dance. We eventually found the hall with the assistance of the local sheriff. A most enjoyable night was had by all, finishing with a pizza supper. We left Grant's Pass for Portland where we spent two nights, the second of which was spent at a square dance, but before we journeyed to the dance we were guests at the home of Barbara and Bill for dinner. Once again I say the hospitality of square dancers is something that has to be experienced.

We left on Tuesday, 23rd June for a journey to Seattle where we passed Mount St. Helens (recently erupted) and Mount Rainier, a 14,500 pile with permanent glaciers, invisible in cloud.

We arrived at Bremerton and journeyed across Puget Sound on the ferry to Seattle, a modern, bustling city with impressive buildings full of interest. Our accommodation was within walking distance of the Convention Centre. The Convention was a great success, over 27,000 being registered. They danced morning, noon and night each day for three days, culminating with the Grand Parade on the Saturday evening on to the football stadium where the largest square dance was held. A bracket of two tips was danced to one

caller and will now be recorded in the Guinness Book of Records. After a most interesting and enjoyable stay at Seattle we continued on our way, the weather being very kind to us. We stayed at Spokane, then Yellowstone National Park, passed the Teton Mountains, through Jacksonhole, on to Salt Lake City, to Bryce Canyon (and what a place this is—much smaller than the Grand Canyon, but the colours are unbelievable), on to Zion National Park and then on to Las Vegas where the weather was very hot. After a two-night stop we left for San Diego, where we again had a most enjoyable square dance.

After leaving San Diego we visited the Crystal Cathedral en route to Anaheim. The Cathedral is a fantastic expensive masterpiece of architecture and structural engineering built by the TV preacher. We spent three very full days at Anaheim and then left for Los Angeles airport where we were to fly to Honolulu for a couple of days before arriving home at Tullamarine.

The fact that twenty-eight people, some of whom had not met prior to the tour, were together for thirty-five days in friendship and harmony is something to think about. The smoothness with which the tour went along speaks volumes for the organisation behind it, due especially to Edna and Jim Daniel. Thank you both for a memorable experience.

## ROUND DANCING IN WESTERN AUSTRALIA

An article on Round Dancing in Western Australia was what the State Editor had asked for — for the Review. So we begin.

Round Dancing has been here for some time. Fluctuating fortunes though have caused it to be "unavailable" to the majority. Recently, however, it has been brought into the limelight. As a result there has been a definite increase in the number of people learning Round Dancing.

Dancers can learn to Round Dance and/or Round Dance at least four nights a week if they wish. The majority of square dance clubs offering Round Dancing do so in a pre-square dance time period as well as having several rounds during the square dance evening. One club, at least, offers a weekly learning programme centred around Round Dancing.

I would say that all people currently Round Dancing or learning Round Dancing are square dancers. This stems from the fact that in W.A. Round Dancing does not exist as a separate entity but is an integral

part of the square dance evening.

Those giving tuition in Round Dancing are offering a little more variety for those square dancers who are looking for something different.

Just before finishing, I'd like to list for you a few of the more familiar rounds being danced here: "Dancing Shadows," "Maple Leaf Rag," "Shantytown," "Sleepy Time Gal," "Wildflowers," "Manita Waltz," "My Wife's House," "Till Somebody Loves You," "Waltz With Me."

Round Dancing (as an integral part of the Square Dance scene) in Western Australia is still relatively small, but it is hoped that in the future, with the assistance of interested square dance callers, this form of dance will grow and more people will take a two-step or two and be able to enjoy the experience.

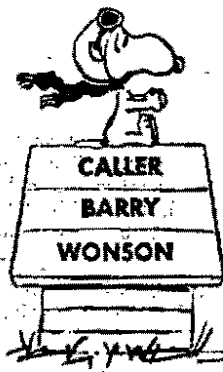

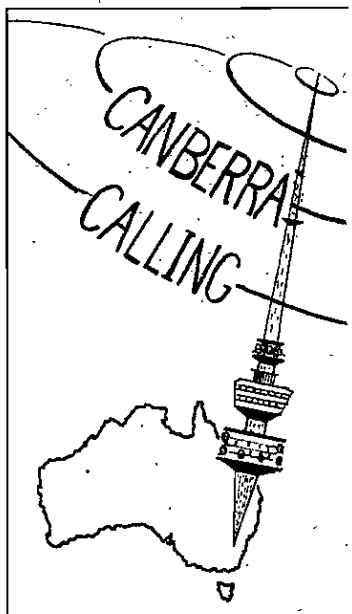

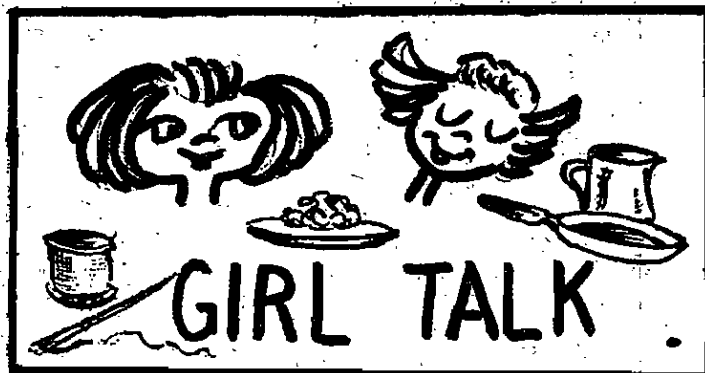

- 4 chops, 10 ounces each
- 4 sheets foil, each 12 x 16 inches
- 2 medium tomatoes, cut in half
- 2 small white onions
- 2 teaspoons mixed herbs
- Salt and pepper to taste

### Method:

Brown chops in pre-heated non-stick pan over gentle heat,  
turning once, until done on both sides—about 15 minutes. Put  
one chop in the centre of each sheet of foil. Top each chop with  
a half sliced tomato and sliced onion. Sprinkle with the mixed  
herbs, salt and pepper. Wrap, double folding the edges to make  
a tightly sealed package. Bake on a scone tray for 20 mins. at  
400 degrees F., or longer at lower temperature if dinner must  
wait. Serve in foil at table.

## "HEADS LEAD RIGHT"

Here are some combinations that will give you this result.

- Hds touch  $\frac{1}{2}$  . . . walk and dodge.
- Hds do-sa-do to ocean wave, fan the top . . . step thru.
- Hds spin the top . . . turn thru.
- Hds pass the ocean Ladies trade . . . step thru.
- Hds pass the ocean Recycle . . . square thru three-quarters.
- Hd ladies chain Hds half square thru.
- Hd ladies chain Hds star thru . . . pass thru.
- Hds right and left thru Hd ladies chain, flutter wheel Sweep  $\frac{1}{2}$  . . . pass thru.
- Hd ladies chain Hds rollaway . . . star thru.
- Hds rollaway, touch  $\frac{1}{2}$  Centre girls pull by.

A nice get out from 1p2p: 1p2p, pass thru, wheel and deal Zoom, centres star thru Pass thru, u-turn back Touch  $\frac{1}{2}$ , cen. girls— Right pull by, 1/alle.

Some zeros, using hinge (single hinge or hinge  $\frac{1}{2}$ ).

## FROM FACING COUPLES

- Do-sa-do to ocean wave Hinge, scoot back, boys run Right and left thru. Slide thru, (zero).
- Do-sa-do to ocean wave Hinge, split circulate Scoot back, walk and dodge Partner trade Right and left thru Slide thru. (Zero.)
- Swing thru, hinge Split circulate Scoot back, boys run Slide thru (zero).

- 1p2p, pass thru, boys run Girls fold 4 Boys swing thru Boys recycle Boys square thru 3 Pass to the centre Girls square thru 3 Star thru Promenade. Home.
- Novelty. Number one couple only Face your corner and Box the gnat, square the set. Sds. pass thru around one To a line of four Pass thru, wheel and deal Double pass thru, track II Split circ., boys run Forward and back Calif. twirl, forward and back Bend the line Slide thru, 1/alle. (1-4)

## SEQUENCE FINDER

If all dancers are paired but you don't know if they're "in" or "out" of sequence, try this: (1) From a promenade call 1 and 3 wheel around, pass thru, bend the line. You now have either a zero line or ZL-OS with head couples on the left end of each line (but you still can't tell if you're

in or out of sequence!). (2) Call couples 1 and 2 do a half sashay. If two couples in the same line do it, the couples were in sequence, but if only one couple in each line does it (you'll now have two boys in one line standing side by side), you'll know you were "out" of sequence. (3) Call "Pass thru, boys fold, star thru." If you were in sequence at the end of step 2, you'll now be out (ZL-OS) and if you were out, you'll now be in (ZL).

Creating and setting out choreography for mainstream dancers is not an easy job. It is even more difficult sticking to standard formations and keeping away from all position dancing.

The following will set up lines for you as BB-GG (boy, boy, girl, girl) with the boys as the left hand couple.

- Hds pass thru, Around one to a line
  - 1p2p, pass thru, wheel and deal Outsides squeeze in to a line
  - 1p2p, pass thru, wheel and deal Double pass thru, cen. in, Cast off  $\frac{1}{2}$ 's.
  - 1p2p, pass thru, wheel and deal Double pass thru Peel off, bend the line.
- The above will set up the lines as mentioned for your creative choreo. The choreo could and can have the centre dancers working together and this set up has them in normal formation for all figures. The outsides or ends of the line will slide thru or star thru to end facing in so all action is normal!

Here are some examples:

- Hds pass thru Around one to a line "Centres" right and left thru "Centres" flutter wheel And sweep  $\frac{1}{2}$  "Ends" star thru, zoom, Centres pass thru 1/alle 1-4.
- 1p2p, pass thru, wheel and deal Outsides squeeze in to a line Centre 4 pass the ocean and recycle Ends star thru Centres right and left thru Zoom, square thru 3 Left allemande (1-4).
- 1p2p, pass-thru, wheel and deal Double pass thru Centres in, cast off  $\frac{1}{2}$ 's Ends slide thru Cen. touch  $\frac{1}{2}$  and Walk and dodge, 1/alle 1-4.
- 1p2p, pass thru, wheel and deal Double pass thru

Peel off, bend the line Touch  $\frac{1}{2}$ , all 8 circ. Trade and roll to face Pass thru Tag the line right Wheel and deal, dive thru Square thru  $\frac{1}{2}$ , 1/alle.

## PING PONG CIRCULATE A.P.D.

- 1p2p. Pass thru, wheel and deal Cen. swing thru Ping pong circ. Cen. extend to a wave, Swing thru, boys run Pass thru, wheel and deal Cen. square thru  $\frac{1}{2}$  L/alle. (1-4).
- 1-4 Swing thru, boys run Tag the line Cloverleaf, girls swing thru Ping pong circ. Boys extend to a wave Boys run Star thru, pass thru. 1/alle.
- Hds pass thru Around one to a line Pass thru, wheel and deal Girls swing thru Ping pong circulate Boys swing thru Ping pong circ. Girls extend to a wave Split circulate: Boys run, slide-thru. L/alle.

A little peek at Square Thru—a very common call, but it can provide many ending formations.

- From a static square, hds or sds square thru brings us to an 8-chn thru formation.
- From an 8-chn thru formation the square thru brings us to lines facing out.
- From lines of four facing, the square thru brings us to a trade by set up.

Examples:

- Static Square Hds square thru four (all facing corner 1-4). (a) Right and left thru, Dive thru, square thru 3 L/allemande. (b) Slide thru. Square thru 3, 1/alle.
- From box 1-4 (8 chn thru formation) square thru four (lines facing out all with corner for partner). (a) U-turn back. L/alle. (b) Partner trade Square thru  $\frac{1}{2}$ . L/alle. (c) Partner trade and roll Box the gnat Change hands. L/alle.

From 1p2p line Square thru four (ends in trade by formation) (a) Trade by, swing thru Boys run, couples circ Wheel and deal, pass thru. L/alle. (b) Cen. pass thru Cen. in, cast off  $\frac{1}{2}$  Star thru zoom Cen. pass thru Box the gnat Grand right and left.
