SQUARE DANCING AT THE JACARANDA FESTIVAL

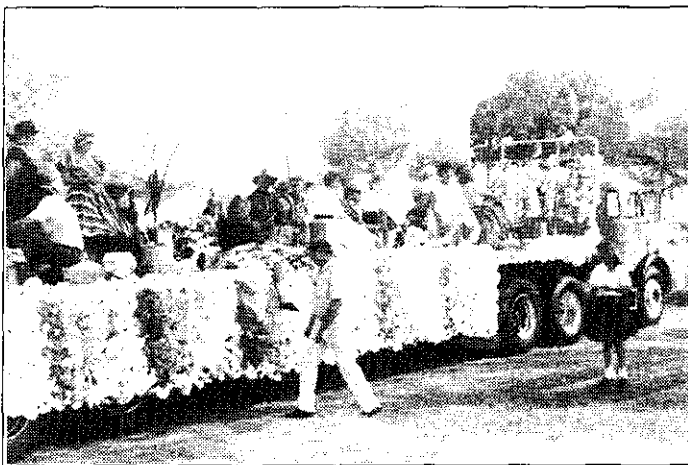

LETTER TO THE EDITOR

A SQUARE DANCE PROBLEM

RON JONES.

It is not often that callers running clubs voice in the Review the problems of maintaining the square dance population. There is always someone who will disagree and become "Anti" that particular caller. It should however be obvious to many dancers and callers there are far too many special functions, weekends away and party nights and outings in New South Wales with not enough dancers to go round.

Our visit to America this year revealed that in many areas clubs were very concerned at the diminishing square dance public and it should be obvious to all that many clubs are just making way and could do with 50% more dancers in New South Wales.

Twenty five years ago the slogan was "Back Your Club" and all dancers were aware of the need to introduce new dancers to square dancing.

We developed in New South Wales three dances, the Ball, the Cabaret, and the Xmas Party where all clubs met and danced together and the rule was only the Society was able to run large functions with funds gained to be used for the promotion of new clubs and square dancing. This worked fine for several years and we progressed to having the largest number of dancers of any state of Australia.

Unfortunately, these days we find that the majority of dancers are no longer imbued with the desire to attend their own club, rather we seem to have devel-

oped dancers whose desire is to dance only where they will get the best dancing at a level to their liking. They will float from club to club and if the caller commences taking in new beginners they immediately change clubs. Consequently many callers only promote new beginners once a year instead of twice per year. This means beginner intake is much lower than in past years.

Then we have the situation in New South Wales where in the past we encouraged and helped country areas to commence square dancing as part of our projected program to bring square dancing to all New South Wales. This seems to have backfired to a large extent as there are now approximately 10 or 12 of these country towns running large weekends away, some three or four times per year and some by clubs of only one or two sets, and one that does not even operate weekly but only sometimes.

It should be obvious to all that the Sydney clubs are carrying the load of supplying the dancers to all these functions. It would appear that we have up to 25 large functions in Sydney and Country areas combined per year and this has resulted in a dancer attitude of "Back the large function" and the weekly club is only where you go when there is nothing else on. Control of square dancing has been lost.

Some years ago we suggested to country areas to combine their functions and form a society north and south and run limited functions for the areas they are in but this has not eventuated. I suggest once again that country areas north and south of Sydney combine and run only one or two functions per year because frankly Sydney clubs are being ripped off by our country cousins.

The obvious result will be a diminishing square dance public in N.S.W. The control of Square Dancing seems to be non-existent and nobody cares only the callers running the Sydney clubs.

KNOW YOUR ROUND DANCING No. 63

Carl Miller

This month we are going to look at two MVTS that you may not have danced yet, but soon will, as Tango becomes more widely used. Both movements are or are normally eight Q Steps, but as I will explain shortly, with Serpiente this is a problem when a different timing is used.

GAUCHO TURN

The GAUCHO TURN is a continuous ROCK, REC action with a 1/8 turn on each step. Even counts are used for each step with each step Q unless otherwise Cued.

Step DIAG SD and in the cued DIR on the active foot and turn 1/8, REC DIAG SD and in the OPP DIR on the new active foot and Turn 1/8. Repeat 4 times (8 Steps/Beats). Start and Finish POS/DIR and Active foot identical.

The ROUNDALAB definition only defines GOUCHO TURN as a FWD movement in CP (DIAG SD & FWD etc with Ms L & Ws R) but this only proves the definition is incomplete because it must define a BKWD MVT for the W. Therefore there is nothing to stop it being danced BKWD for M & FWD for the W.

The number of steps is as cued. No indication is given by ROUNDALAB as to the timing of the last step for an odd number of steps so in keeping with my previous conventions, this implies that when an odd number of steps is cued the last step is Slow.

SERPIENTE

Step SD on the active foot, cross BHND with the new active foot. Bring the first foot from in front and FAN it out to the side but don't place any weight on the foot. Cross BHND with the first foot, step SD, Step THRU, bring the new active foot from behind and FAN it out to the side, then step THRU.

Start POS is facing with OPP footwork, SHADOW

or SD by SD with identical footwork. Ending Pos is as Cued. Start and ending active foot is the same.

Warning: This MVT will usually finish is SCP. As such, the FAN on the eighth step, is dangerous if you FAN too widely, you could end up kicking each other.

Many dances actually have SERPIENTE's in them, MARIA is one of them, but there are very few with 8 Q steps.

ROUNDALAB defines it as 8 Q steps then adds, that timing may vary. This has got to be the wrong approach. I have yet to see the defined timing used. With the defined timing and all these variations to choose from, which one is a visiting dancer going to use in dance they do not know.

The timings I have seen are;

- 1: Q,Q,Q,Q; Q,Q,Q,Q; 8 beats
- 2: Q,Q,S,—; Q,Q,Q,Q; S,—, 9 beats

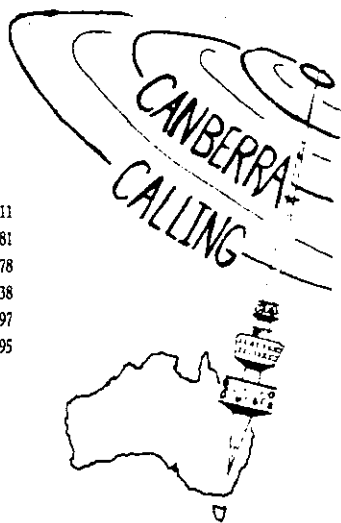

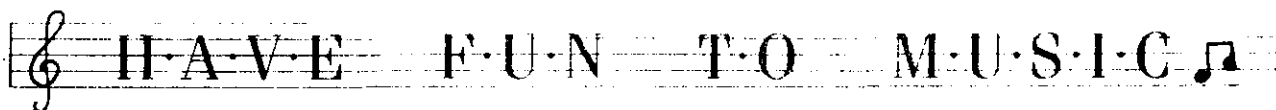

FROM THE EDITOR

I was reading some old Square Dance Reviews recently when I came across an article in the June 1969 issue, I have reprinted part of the article below:

"It has been proven that 80 per cent of active square dancers last only two years, 18 per cent last around five years and 2 per cent go on forever.

About 11 p.m. one evening in August, 1951, Dorrie and Bill Rolph were returning from the local pictures when they were attracted to the Rivoli Ballroom, Hurstville, by sounds of square dance music. While rubbernecking, they were handed two complimentary tickets for the 30 and Over Square Dance Club at Rockdale Paradance.

Eighteen years later they are still vitally interested; in fact, Bill is the convener for the 11th National Convention in Sydney this year and Dorrie is still his most sincere critic.

They were active foundation members of Belmore, Greenwich, Startimers, Clempton Park, Circle Eight and Wanderers and were badge members of 30 and Over, Pioneer, Riverview, Docey Do, Narwee and Waggon Wheelers Square Dance Clubs.

They were also foundation members of the Square Dance Society of N.S.W. in which Bill has held every executive office except treasurer and magazine editor, although he did print the magazine when it was roneo'd."

It is now January 1991 and another 21 years have come and gone since that article was printed. I am very happy to be able to report that both Bill and Dorrie are still very active in square dancing. They attend the Wanderers Square Dance Club where they are both on the Committee, Dorrie holds the position of Secretary/Treasurer and also collects the money at the door. The eighteen years last reported has now become thirty nine years.
