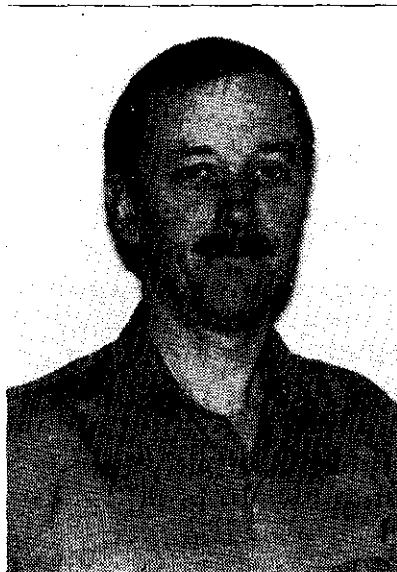

JACK DALZIEL TESTIMONIAL DANCE

Over 200 dancers honoured veteran caller Jack Dalziel, affectionately known as "Dizzy", at a Testimonial Dance organised by Gold Coast clubs Tugun Twirlers and Burleigh Squares on Saturday 11th May at the Tweed Heads Civic Centre.

Jack, now in his seventies, came to the Gold Coast from the Northern Rivers district in 1972. He and his wife Greta began dancing with Jack Looby's club "The Gold Coasters" and 4 years later formed their own club "Tugun Twirlers".

As a result of his happy association with various clubs over the past 15 years, many long-standing friendships were formed. Visitors are always welcome at Jack's dances and southern visitors regularly dance with the Tugun Twirlers. Although retiring as Director/Caller of that club Jack will from time to time entertain as guest caller.

Thirteen callers from Queensland and New South Wales attended the Testimonial to honour Jack. Bill McHardy from Toowoomba and Don Proellocks from Brisbane recalled the early days of Jack's pranks and quick wit. Jack was instrumental in assisting young callers and encouraging them to embark on a calling career. Protégés of Jack are Roy Stokes of Summerland Squares, Craig Chandler of Ferriswheelers and Charles Watson of Burleigh Squares. Roy Stokes who is a long standing member of Tugun Twirlers and Brian Carter who moved from New Zealand and joined Tugun Twirlers 12 months ago will continue to call at Tugun on Wednesday nights.

A combined hard working committee headed by Presidents Graham Butler and Ron Glover provided a successful and entertaining programme. At supper many old acquaintances were renewed and lots of reminiscing of the early days of square dancing.

President of the Square Dancing Society of Queensland, Merv Duplock and his wife Zilla, presented Jack and Greta with gifts and flowers along with a framed "Certificate of Appreciation" which will no doubt take place of honour over "Dizzy's Bar".

Jack, who only admits to 50 years, reckons he is too young to retire however having travelled several times to America, now wants to explore Australia's outback — the Northern Territory, Kakadu, Darwin and Katherine, before heading back to the Gold Coast in September. LETTER TO THE EDITOR

As a dancer of a showcase at this year's National Convention, I wish to make some comments on Carl Miller's article.

The dancers presenting the Showcase are not professionals. We are presenting a dance for consideration by callers, cuers and dancers as to what they would like to teach and/or dance in their clubs and at functions in the forthcoming year.

I believe each couple presenting a dance not only had pride in presenting a dance before such a large audience but were nervous about it, especially as they must remember the dance. It is always easy to dance to a cue, or in your own club where if you have a memory blackout or make a mistake you can start again, in front of a few hundred people it is not quite so easy and mistakes are embarrassing.

Viewing videos will always pick up differences and/or mistakes as people express their own style when dancing.

An experienced dancer will always continue dancing so as to give an "illusion" of knowing the dance. With the future use of videos perhaps a "teaching" video will be established as such to assist.

With the use of cues from the Adelaide Convention in 1992, the dancers of the showcase will be able to place more emphasis on their style, it will certainly help the audience identify steps, providing the presenter doesn't go overboard.

Anyway, I believe a showcase is supposed to be:—

(a) presented in a clear uncomplicated manner which will encourage dancers on to the floor, not like some where people walked off the floor because someone tried to teach "his style" and not the dance movements and

(b) a new dance which has not been seen and is not generally danced in the clubs.

As for the ARDA rules, I believe the showcase may be chosen from a level up to and including Phase III and should be cued from the published cue sheet when teaching.

Queensland was not the only state to have their choice of dance rejected. Victoria's first dance was rejected, although being a **Phase II plus** and falling within guidelines, there was a step in it not currently being danced. We therefore chose another dance as we believe the dancers have the right to expect seven dances to be presented.

During the convention in 1986 ARDA voted to use head cues from sheet and steps should not be moved between levels, ie. a chaise is a level III and not the correct movement for **sd. cl. sd.** as has been cued in **Rhumba Maria**.

ARDA is going to set guidelines perhaps the cuers who help to set these guidelines would abide by them, it would certainly encourage dancers to learn and progress through new movements and would not create confusion when dancing to another cuer.

I believe we will always disagree on what are good and/or bad dances and it's just as well we are all different as life would certainly be boring

In addition, I think we should remember we are presenting the showcase for people to elect for future inclusion in the "Convention Round List" for the benefit of all dancers.

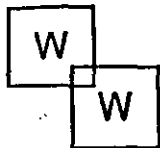

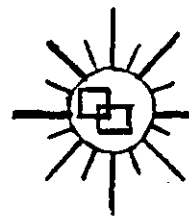
FOUR DIFFERENT ANSWERS

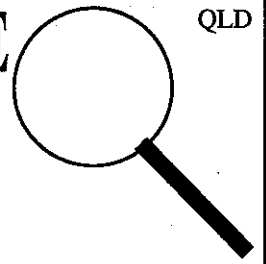

PUBLIC RELATIONS REPORT

What is the National Society? What do they do? Why do we need them?

These sort of questions are being asked, so at the half yearly meeting of the National Society I was appointed to be the Public Relations Officer. If you will all bear with me during the next few months I shall attempt to give you some background on the National Society and answer some of these questions.

Until I get my act together I would like to tell you about an historical event that happened at the half yearly meeting — No, not my appointment.

Usually all the committee and the delegates meet together in one of the States and they attend a function in that state. As a trial this year, instead of most of the delegates travelling long distances, they held their meeting over the telephone by way of a conferlink. This meant that each state had its delegates at one designated phone in each state (hands free phones were used) and then through Telecom the phones were all conferenced together. It was very exciting to be sitting in and a part of this experimental run.

Bernie Francis from WA is the president of the National Society and he was the chairman for this meeting. As you can imagine a lot of preparation goes into a meeting like this. State reports were sent to the secretary along with anything else we thought should be brought up at the meeting. A list of state speaking order was established prior to the meeting along with an agenda, and each state was given time to speak on any subjects that were brought up. The meeting lasted about one and a quarter hours and every one agreed that in future all the half yearly meetings be held through conferlink.

This means that the "already very busy" State delegates do not have to travel interstate for a weekend. Instead, they sit by their phone and achieve the same meeting results, saving their time and money. The cost of confer link is considerably cheaper than a trip interstate.

The National Society has two meetings a year. The AGM is held at the National Convention and the half yearly is usually about half way between AGM's.

Marion Brown from Victoria is the Historian and Pauline Hansford of NSW is the Public Relations Officer. These two positions are not executive. All affiliated bodies have a delegate at the meeting and this is usually the President of that affiliate. If the affiliated delegate is on the executive or unable to attend the meeting then another delegate can be nominated. Observers from any state are always welcome at the meetings.

This month we will look at a few more American style Foxtrot MVTs. The next couple of months we will look at a few of the Basic International Foxtrot MVTs, just to get some idea of the change of style that occurs and the extra bit of concentration and inclination required to get into that style of dancing.

MANEVRE

M takes a reaching step across in front of the W, across her DOD on the active foot and turns to face her. The W takes a small step in the DOD and, if necessary, turns to face their partner, she may be facing the OPP DIR to the M. Both take a step to the SD on the new active foot, then CL the first foot.

The second step to the SD is slightly DOD as well. The turn to the partner hasn't completed yet. The turn will be completed on the second step. This is more easily demonstrated than written, so please see your instructor when reviewing this definition.

A very important note about the MANUV. The M **MUST** (and I emphasize **MUST**) move right in front of the inactive person. Otherwise the extra bit of turn that was not executed will be added to the next MVT. If the next MVT has a turn then both dancers are in for trouble.

CHAIR

This is the first MVT looked at that is not a 3 step MVT with a SQQ timing. Simply, step FWD lowering in the front leg with the BK leg slightly bent and the back straight (upright), giving a look and posture of sitting in a chair. The timing is just S.

CHASSE

This is the first MVT with SYNCOPATED timing. All variations of the MVT are SQ&Q. Step FWD or BK (depending on the DOD of the previous MVT) while turning to face the partner. SD/CL, SD to the ending POS. Start and end POS may be different, start and end free foot are the same. This is the equivalent MVT to the Waltz SYNCO CHASSE.

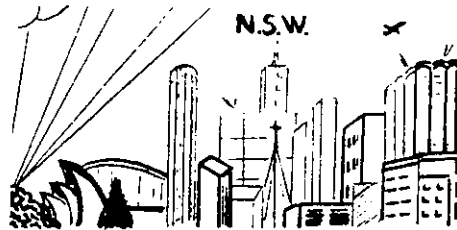

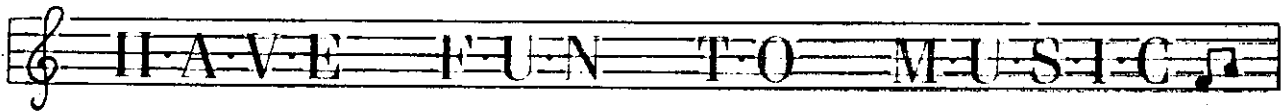
